Q: Do I need to book?

Q: What happens if I can only get to one in my district?

A: That's great. The networks have been set up to help you get to know others you will be working with. The more you can attend, the more opportunities you will have, but obviously not everyone can attend all.

Q: Do I have to stay for the whole 2 hours?

A: Not necessarily. However the 2 hours is planned to include relevant, useful information and so, where possible, you are encouraged to stay for the whole 2 hours.

Q: Why have the networks been set up for every two weeks? This seems a lot.

A: February and March are all about getting ready to 'go live' with integrated practices such as Common Assessment Framework and Lead Professional etc and so it is hoped that staff will value the opportunity to explore these processes further and to meet people who will part of the same Multi-Agency Team (MAT). There is no expectation that everyone has to attend all groups, but the idea is to provide a supportive, informal network for you to continue your professional development around integrated practice.
